FCIA's Firestop Level 1-4 Certificate of Achievement Education Programs offer FCIA Member Specialty Firestop Installation Contractors, Special Inspection Agency personnel, and their staff the opportunity to dive deep into the world of firestopping. With education covering the introductory 'DIIM' of Firestopping to the more advanced systems selection and analysis, the program is a comprehensive program for all involved in the installation and inspection of installed firestop systems.

FCIA Contractor Member personnel have been plowing through the program, getting FCAEP Certificates to build better industry knowledge for their company. The \$1,000 Annual Subscription for FCIA's Certificate of Achievement Program is a real bargain for the educational value provided.

The Level 1 and Level 2 Courses are being recognized by UL for 20 hours (2 CEU's) for Level 1 and 2 combined. For DRI's in the UL Qualified Firestop Contractor Program, it means .5 CEU's for Level 1 (5 hours) and 1 .5 CEU'S for Level 2 (15 hours) towards keeping a DRI Status current.

FCIA MEETS WITH UL & FM

Since 1999, the FCIA Accreditation
Committee has been leading
the charge to develop recognized
Specialty Firestop Installation Contractor
accreditation programs to improve fire and
life safety around the world.

FCIA's Accreditation Committee leaders met with both UL and FM Approvals leadership in November/December 2022 with suggestions about how the programs can become even more widely accepted in the industry.

The FCIA Accreditation Committee worked with FM Approvals to build the FM 4991, Standard for the Approval of Firestop Contractors Program in 1999. The Committee worked with UL in 2003-2006 to launch UL's Qualified Firestop Contractor Program. Combined, there are over 200 contractors worldwide that are either FM 4991 Approved or UL-ULC Qualified Contractors.

FCIA ADVOCATES FOR FIRESTOP AT ICC

FCIA is active at the International Code Council (ICC), advocating to keep fire and life safety at the forefront of the discussion.

Through 2022, FCIA's presence at the International Code Council's Code Development Process focused on keeping people safe in new and existing buildings, keeping fire-resistance an important concept in 104.11, alternative materials, design and methods of construction and equipment.

In response to an exchange where it was stated that fireresistance has been eliminated from the Code, FCIA stated "Fire Resistance has NOT been eliminated", otherwise, that was

what was on record. "To provide an alternative material/system, proof of performance based on Chapter 7's requirements for fire-resistance and firestopping has to take place." And, we worked on a lot more too...

BARRIER MANAGEMENT SERVICES EXPERTS & FIRE CODES

Not all who perform work in existing buildings can claim to be true Barrier Management experts.

Building Owners and Managers are required by the International Fire Code, NFPA 101, NFPA 1, the National Fire Code of Canada, UAE Fire and Life Safety Code of Practice, and other codes to maintain all types of fire-resistance-rated and smoke-resistant assemblies for the life of the building. This includes the installed Firestopping, Fire Doors, Fire Dampers, Fire-Resistance-Rated Walls and Floors, and Fire-Rated Glazing in existing buildings.

Building owners need to understand what the building's fire-resistance-rated walls and floors and other fire protection features are in order to manage them. The International Fire Code (IFC) calls this the "inventory". The requirement for maintaining protection – the annual visual inspection and records kept of the inspection and repairs – is stated loud and clear in the IFC, Section 701.6.

701.6 Owner's responsibility. The owner shall maintain an inventory of all required fire-resistance-rated construction, construction installed to resist the passage of smoke and the construction included in Sections 703 through 707 and Sections 602.4.1 and 602.4.2 of the International Building Code. Such construction shall be visually inspected by the owner annually and properly repaired, restored or replaced where damaged, altered, breached or penetrated. Records of inspections and repairs shall be maintained. Where concealed, such elements shall not be required to be visually inspected by the owner unless the concealed space is accessible by the removal or movement of a panel, access door, ceiling tile or similar movable entry to the space. [IFC 2021, 701.6]

If you have building owners and manager, facility director customers, help them protect building occupants through a planned fire-resistance-rated and smoke-resistant assembly program that maintains protection. Advise your customer that fire code requirements are discoverable should there be loss of life or property in a fire condition where unprotected breaches allowed for fire or smoke spread beyond the room of

origin. As was stated by an attendee at a conference, "build a program to maintain protection so you are sitting in row 2 of the courtroom, instead of being prosecuted".
