FCIA PRESENTS AT THE NFPA CONFERENCE

This June, FCIA presented an education session at the National Fire Protection Association's Expo in Las Vegas, NV.

FCIA's education program at the National Fire Protection Association's Expo in Las Vegas, mid-June was packed, standing room only.

Bill McHugh presented a session on fire-resistance importance in new construction and existing buildings to a standing-room only, rapt audience. The question was asked, "How many building owners do you think maintain Fire Sprinklers and Fire Detection & Alarms?"

"Commonplace", said the audience.

"How many building owners do you think maintain protection of their fire-resistance-rated assemblies?"

"What?" said the audience.

That started the hour-long conversation on maintaining protection of fire-resistance in existing buildings. Special emphasis was added to point out that the International Fire Code demands a fire-resistance inventory, and NFPA 101, NFPA 1, and other worldwide Fire Codes require maintaining continuous fire-

resistance protection.

The aim of the session was to provide information attendees can use to encourage Building Owners and Managers to change the standard practice of ongoing building maintenance to include fire-resistance, just as they would any other safety protection. NFPA's Audience was a great place to do this.

The new FCIA Education Portal (FEP) Admin Portal is live! y

This May, FCIA announced the rollout of the new Admin Portal to the FCIA Education Program (FEP). The new Admin feature allows companies who purchase the Unlimited Subscription to designate a training admin to enroll students in the purchased courses, monitor progress of employees as they take the courses and exams, and download Certificates of Completion for enrolled students of the company. The portal promises to be a game-changer for those companies who purchase the Unlimited Subscription.

In addition to announcing the Admin Portal, FCIA Board President and Education Committee Chair, Tyler Ferguson (National

Firestopping Solutions), announced that the Firestop Level 3 Program, 'Specifications, Estimating and Project Management', is in the final stages of development. The content has been recorded and is currently working its way through the production process. Look for a limited release in the coming months.

CAN/ULC-S115-2018, STANDARD METHOD OF FIRE TESTS OF FIRESTOP SYSTEMS, is the Canadian equivalent to UL 1479, UL 2079, and incorporates all of ASTM E 2307, Perimeter Fire Containment.

FCIA submitted several proposals to the ULC S115 Standards Development Process to recognize various physical performance properties.
