

FCIA Heads to Ottawa, ON with Firestop Education Canadian 'DIIM' Symposium

The Firestop Contractors International Association is holding their annual Canadian 'DIIM' Symposium this September 9-10, 2015 at The Brookstreet Hotel in Ottawa, ON.

The Firestop Contractors International Association (FCIA) is strongly focused on promoting knowledge and awareness of the importance of Life Safety and Firestopping and Effective Compartmentation within the healthcare, education and other building occupancies.

Each year, FCIA hosts two industry Conferences, an industry Trade Show and several additional Educational Symposiums worldwide, as well as monthly free Educational Webinars. The annual Canadian 'DIIM' Symposium focuses on the 'DIIM' of Firestopping – proper **D**esign, Installation, Inspection and **M**aintenance/**M**anagement – following the National Building Code of Canada. This year's Canadian Symposium will take place at The Brookstreet Hotel in Ottawa, ON and features a half-day tour of the National Research Council Canada's (NRC) Almonte Fire-Test Facility.

Life Safety is a universal concern, and Firestopping and Effective Compartmentation are the tools needed to ensure Life Safety by restricting the spread of fire and smoke in buildings, which when left unprotected may cause structural collapse and open the door for potential loss of life. When Firestop Systems are installed by Specialty Firestop Contractors who practice the 'DIIM' of Firestopping, the reliability of Firestop Systems as a critical component of Effective Compartmentation is improved.

In order for Firestopping and Effective Compartmentation to work, all wall, floor and ceiling penetrations need to become fire-resistance-rated and smoke-resistance-rated, just like the walls. Specific **D**esign standards, rigorous FM 4991 and ULC Qualified Contractor Program Installation protocols, systematic and thorough Inspections and comprehensive ongoing **M**aintenance and **M**anagement programs (**DIIM**) are required to keep a tested and listed Firestop **SYSTEM** working for the life-cycle of the building. One detail missed, one step skipped and the system is voided and the occupancy has the potential for breach.

The Canadian 'DIIM' Symposium is a two-day event tailored to Firestop Contractors, Special Inspection Agencies and their Special Inspectors, Firestop Associates, Manufacturers, Manufacturer Reps and Distributors.

Additionally, the group seeks to educate individuals representing the Architects and Specifiers who **Design** and specify Firestop Systems, the Building, Fire Code and Government Officials who **Inspect** these Systems and the Facility Engineers who **Maintain and Manage** the Systems in buildings and opens the Symposium to these **Qualified Guests** by offering **FREE registration** to those who qualify.
