This is a scam. FCIA does not sell our Membership list. Period. We take the privacy of our Membership very seriously, and as such all companies that we are aware of have been issued "Cease and Desist" letters.

FCIA at the ICC Committee Action Hearings

t's Code Development Season and FCIA is involved at the International Code Council's Committee Action Hearings for the International Building Code and International Fire Code in Columbus, OH. FCIA Code Consultant Bill Koffel, along with the FCIA Code Committee and Bill McHugh, submitted several proposals on FCIA's behalf.

The group presented the proposal S21-18 to add Special Inspection for Residential Occupancy Buildings with occupant load greater than 250. The good news is that the proposal was Approved as Submitted with a vote of 13-0. If there is no public comment, it will become part of the 2021 International Building Code. We'll know for sure by December 2018.

Another proposal FCIA submitted would mandate FM 4991 Approved or UL Qualified Firestop Contractors for buildings 420' above the lowest fire department access. The proposal, FS47-18, was disapproved, 9-5. While that may seem like a disappointing result, that's a big improvement from the 13-0 last code cycle.

FCIA also submitted a proposal that requires and standardizes how firestop system are identified on the assemblies. This proposal, FS46-18, to add identification systems, also known as labels, tags and other methods to identify the system, was disapproved 8-6. Again, that's a lot better than the 12-0 we were at during the last code cycle.

In F90-18, FCIA's proposal calls for adding language such that when performing repairs of existing buildings, the repairs follow manufacturers' installation instructions and the listing, when the original permit requires systems.

These proposals continue to show FCIA's moves to build specs, standards and code requirements that result in the proper 'DIIM' – 'D'esign, 'I'nstallation, 'I'nspection and 'M'aintenance – of firestop systems. We are very pleased that the ICC's process produced positive results – even if we did not win some.

CIA met with manufacturers and a consultant to discuss the ASTM E 2174 and ASTM E 2393 Inspection Standard Practices, the ASTM E 3038 Inspector Qualification Practice, ASTM E 3037 on movement of penetrating items in firestop assemblies, the ASTM Guide and much more. FCIA's Standards Chair Eric Keeton, and Vice President, Jay McGuire attended the San Diego Meetings.




