## FCIA BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEET


he **FCIA Board of Directors** met in early February to strategize FCIA's 2021 actions and initiatives.

### ICC BUILDING SAFETY MONTH STARTS THIS MAY

## FCIA AT ASTM

**CIA's Standards Committee** member **Jay McGuire** is the chair of the new Task Group at ASTM building a standard for 'Identification Systems'. Most identify this as labelling firestopping with the system number, contractor contact info, etc. There also can be tags made from plastic, paper, steel, ceramic fiber and more. Where do these ID systems get placed? How close to the penetrating item? On the joint? That's what is being addressed on the first ballot at ASTM. Watch for more as this develops.

## **CODE DEVELOPMENT**

## **NBCC 2025 PROCESS KICKING OFF**

The 2020 National Building Code of Canada (NBCC) code development cycle is still finishing up, reviewing final outstanding issues. The Standing Committee on Fire Protection starts its work in April with a four-hour teleconference to lay groundwork for the 2025 version of the NBCC.

The FCIA and the National Fireproofing Contractors Association (NFCA) have been working with the standing committee on proposals to require independent inspection of firestopping and fireproofing in buildings. The 2020 proposals were disapproved by this committee. The Executive Committee is reviewing if there is an objective in the NBCC, a performance-based code, from which to address this issue. It seems that there is precedence in the sprinkler industry through reference standards that are part of the NBCC that require inspection.

More on this as we work through the process at the National Research Council of Canada.

## NFPA 1, 101, 5000 CODE PROCESS STARTING

The NFPA's development process is different than the ICC's International Code development process. ICC's process includes large, open public hearings in a continuous period, twice during the cycle. NFPA's is a committee development process where technical committees review public inputs.

NFPA 1's Public Inputs are due April 1, while NFPA

<u>101</u> The Life Safety Code, and <u>NFPA 5000</u>, Building Construction and Safety Code, public inputs are due June 1.

Watch for FCIA to insert language to help building owners and managers maintain protection in existing buildings.

# **CODE DEVELOPMENT cont'd**

# **ICC CODE HEARINGS GO VIRTUAL**

The International Code Council's Committee Action Hearings start the public hearing process for development of the 2024 International Family of Codes in the USA. Because of continued concerns about the spread of COVID-19, the hearings have shifted to a virtual program that will take place April 11 through May 5, 2021.

Committees have been appointed by the ICC Board of Directors already. Committee members, moderators, and staff will gather in a large meeting room live (adhering to social distancing guidelines), while participation from the public will take place virtually. The 'Monograph' of all the proposals is available now at www.CDPAccess.org.

FCIA proposals cover contractor qualification/approval, requiring penetration and joint identification systems

(labels), having sleeves installed in accordance with listings, and more.

FCIA participated at the ICC's Fire Code Action Committee (FCAC) with the International Firestop Council as well. The Council topics where FCAC is the proponent include where rated walls meet non-rated roof or ceiling assemblies and introducing the term 'Perimeter Fire Containment System' to section 715.2. Separately, the Council proposes protection of penetrations in exterior walls, adding the term Continuity Head of Wall Joint System, and adding ASTM E2816 (fire-resistive ductwrap) to the code.


