



FCIA AT UL-ULC STANDARDS TECHNICAL PANEL

The UL Standards Technical Panel (STP) is a consensus group that makes changes to the UL 1479, UL 2079. There is also a UL Canada (ULC) Standards Technical Panel that encompasses all the fire-resistance standards, starting with ULC S-101, Standard Methods of Fire Endurance Tests of Building Construction and Materials, and also includes the ULC-S115, Standard Method of Fire Tests of Firestop Systems.

FCIA appreciates the opportunity to bring the field perspective to the UL and ULC Standards Development Process.

FCIA SAFETY ALERT

Firestop Installation Contracting is an amazing construction discipline. Not only does the Specialty Firestop Installation Contractor have to provide an estimate, proposal, negotiate a contract, schedule tested and listed systems, manufacturers installation instructions, safety data sheets and materials, installation and safety equipment and labor, they have to then pass inspections, send invoices on time, and collect payments. One big responsibility is safety. Also, the Specialty Firestop Installation Contractor has to deal with a new jobsite, different construction teams, and their own workforce productivity every job. And, variations in the weather provides a whole other layer of challenge.

NFCA & NY APARTMENT FIRE (AND OTHER TRAGEDIES)

CIA was saddened to hear the news about the Brooklyn, NY high-rise apartment fire and sends condolences to the families who lost homes and loved ones.

Because the building is still standing, the structural fire protection – concrete and/or steel and fireproofing - must have worked. Had the door to the apartment of fire origin been closed, fire and smoke spread might have been minimized as well. While there have been reports that a sprinkler might have helped, the sprinkler is just one of many elements that need to work (together) to protect people and property in buildings.

Fire-resistance-rated and smoke-resistive assemblies, sprinkler suppression systems, detection and alarm systems, plus

occupant education about these systems and what to do upon notification, are needed to protect people in buildings. The education process of all building occupants, all families, needs to be ongoing, and the fire-resistance-rated and smokeresistant assembly protection is mandated to be inspected – where accessible – annually.

With vigilance and a continued commitment to improving fire and life safety in buildings, we will continue to make buildings safer worldwide and minimize – and hopefully eliminate one day – tragedies like this one.
