FCIA Hosts Successful Education and Committee Action Conference



Fresh off the plane from Dallas, TX, FCIA is still riding the high from another<u>Education and</u> <u>Committee Action Conference -</u> <u>ECA 2015</u>.

Held at The Adolphus Hotel in Dallas, TX., Conference attendees were able to take the <u>FM and/or UL/ULC</u> <u>Firestop Exams</u>, as well as attend the FCIA Test Prep and Quality Management System education sessions. Registrants were also exposed to a dynamo lineup of engaging speakers covering a wide-range of topics, including:

- Richard Branch, Dodge Data and Analytics, covered the US and Canada construction economic conditions and a forecast;
- FCIA's 'How Codes Get Adopted Locally - It's Not As Easy As It Looks' panel, which was comprised of six North Texas Council of Building Code Officials, brought the view of



implementing the code from their perspective, with a focus on ASTM E 2174 and ASTM E 2393 Special Inspections;

- The National Association of State Fire Marshals Executive Director Jim Narva covered initiatives including the new Project Fail Safe, a research project that looks at full building fire tests to determine building resiliency;
- A Barrier Management Session on Fire and Smoke Dampers by Greenheck's Marc Sorge, covered the interface of dampers and firestopping in great detail;





- UL's **Luke Woods** challenged the group to look at testing and actual usage of firestop systems in the field for Membrane Penetrations;

FCIA at ICC Code Hearings



FCIA's Code Consultant, Bill Koffel, and FCIA Executive Director, Bill McHugh, plus a host of industry friends, travelled to Memphis to participate at the <u>ICC's</u> <u>Committee Action Hearings</u> (<u>CAH</u>). The CAH span 9 days, and is filled with the various committees hearing proposals from 8am to 7 pm each

day. After the CAH, the results are posted and a round of Public Comments are sought on each proposed change that either was **APPROVED or DISAPPROVED** by a balanced Committee of both industry and governmental officials.

Then, in conjunction with the <u>ICC Annual Conference and</u> <u>Expo</u>, the ICC Public Comment Hearings (PCH) are conducted. At this round of hearings, any public comments made to APPROVED or DISAPPROVED proposals are heard by an assembly of Building Code Officials and Fire Marshals. At this stage, only the governmental members vote.

If no public comment was submitted on an APPROVED or DISAPPROVED proposal, then the results of the committee vote stands and it becomes part of the consent agenda. Finally, the PCH Results are posted and the new edition of the <u>ICC Codes</u> are published.

Bill McHugh was appointed by <u>ICC's Board of Directors</u> to serve with 14 others on the **ICC's Fire Safety Committee** during the CAH process. The Committee heard 3 days of proposals and worked well as a group with many '13-0' scores.

Our hats are off to all those who volunteered on committees and the audience who participated as well.



FCIA Submits ICC Code Development Proposals

The FCIA had several proposals up for consideration at the CAH in Memphis, and the proposals fared well. FCIA's proposals to delete prescriptive language from the Joints section, 715, and add similar language in 715 Penetrations passed at the committee level; however, our proposal for requiring labeling



on walls with the system number on it failed. We had great support from a large university who basically praised the <u>FM</u> <u>4991 Approved</u> and <u>UL Qualified Firestop Contractors</u>that worked on their buildings and the importance of labels and proper labeling.

A proposal from **Anthony Apfelbeck**, a Building Code Official in FL, to expand the scope of <u>Special Inspection in</u> <u>Chapter 17 of the IBC</u> failed. The committee felt the expanded scope covered too many occupancies, but the nice thing to see about this was that a Building Code Official believed the scope should increase. There were quite a few other proposals of interest, including the inclusion of a requirement for contractors accredited by organizations who conform to ISO Standards.

Regarding other fire-related proposals, the International Firestop Council's (IFC) proposal was successful adding exterior fire exposure to the spandrel panel areas of buildings that require perimeter fire containment systems. Additionally, proposals to add the new ASTM E 2816 for duct wraps was defeated, as was the new standard for head of wall joint assemblies, ASTM E 2837.

While talking to friends at the hearings, we had a great compliment on the FCIA Magazine, <u>Life Safety Digest</u>.

"We pass around the magazine in our jurisdiction to all the inspectors. It really is the passive fire protection journal with good educational articles worth reading."
